The Council of the London Borough of Southwark, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984^a, as amended, and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following Order:

Citation and commencement

- 1.1 This Order may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Charged-for parking places) (Brandon Street) Order 202* and shall come into force on 202*.

Interpretation

- 2.1 In this Order:-

“Council” means the Council of the London Borough of Southwark;

“enactment” means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

“map-based schedule” means the map attached to and to be read in conjunction with this Order and the Order of 2021, which depicts the parking place designated by this Order, and, in conjunction with the map schedule legend, identifies the type of each particular parking place and, if appropriate, certain of its governing provisions:

Provided that the Council does not accept responsibility for any inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon to create the map-based schedule and where a parking place is depicted on the map-based schedule, that parking place will continue to apply irrespective of any subsequent changes that have been made to the underlying Ordnance Survey data.

“map schedule legend” means the map schedule legend attached to this Order which, when used in conjunction with the map-based schedule, identifies the specific type of parking place designated by this Order and, where appropriate, certain of its governing provisions;

“the Order of 2021” means the London Borough of Southwark (Charged-For Parking Places) (Map-based) Order 2021^b; and

“traffic sign” means a sign of any size, type and colour prescribed or authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under, section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2021 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Amendment of items in the map-based schedule

- 3.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done, or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the Order of 2021 shall have effect as though:-
 - (a) where there is no existing item at a location depicted in the map-based schedule attached to that Order, there were added to that map-based schedule the item depicted in the map-based schedule attached to this Order; and
 - (b) where there is an existing item at a location depicted in the map-based schedule attached to that Order, there were substituted in that map-based schedule the item depicted in the map-based schedule attached to this Order.
- 3.2 The amendment referred to in Article 3.1 of this Order of an item in the map-based schedule will have the effect of revoking any provision provided or designated by a previous version of that item in the map-based schedule and not incorporated into the latest version.

Designation of parking place and application of the Order of 2021 thereto

- 4.1 Each area on a street identified the map-based schedule as a parking place and, where applicable, by way of the map schedule legend as an area marked out and signed for the use therein of specified classes of vehicles following the conditions specified in the Order of 2021 in relation to that type of parking place, is designated as a parking place.
- 4.2 Unless otherwise so identified, a parking place shall be bounded on one side of its length by the edge of the carriageway and be an area marked either by a traffic sign or by another method of indicating the extent of a parking place as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016^c.
- 4.3 The provisions of the Order of 2021 (other than Articles 4 and 19) shall apply to the area designated as a parking place by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a parking place included a reference to an area designated as a parking place by this Order.

Placing of traffic signs, etc

- 5.1 The Council shall:
 - (a) place and maintain traffic signs or other appropriate markings on the surface of the street indicating the limits of the parking places designated by this Order;
 - (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place, traffic signs indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Articles 5.1 and 5.3 of the Order of 2021; and

- (c) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each pay parking place a traffic sign indicating that such parking place may be used by vehicles making payment of the parking charge by way of the electronic payment system; and the location identification number of such parking place or part thereof; and
- (d) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purpose of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.

This Order, amends items in the map-based schedule attached to the Order of 2021, to reduce existing CPZ 'M2' 'shared-use' parking by 14.5m in Brandon Street south-west side, so as to accommodate the introduction of a new London cycle hire scheme docking station in the London Borough of Southwark.

“map-based schedule” means the map attached to and to be read in conjunction with this Order and the Order of 2021, which depicts the parking places imposed by this Order, and, in conjunction with the map schedule legend, identifies the type of each particular parking place, and, if appropriate, certain of its governing provisions:

Provided that the Council does not accept responsibility for any inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon to create the map-based schedule and where a parking place or waiting restriction is depicted on the map-based schedule, that parking place or waiting restriction will continue to apply irrespective of any subsequent changes that have been made to the underlying Ordnance Survey data.

“map schedule legend” means the map schedule legend attached to this Order which, when used in conjunction with the map-based schedule, identifies the specific type of parking places imposed by this Order and, where appropriate, certain of their governing provisions; and

“the Order of 2021” means the London Borough of Southwark (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Map-based) Order 2021^b.

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2021 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Amendment of items in the map-based schedule

- 3.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done, or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the Order of 2021 shall have effect as though there were removed from that map-based schedule the items indicating the location of a free solo motorcycle parking place in Brandon Street in the map-based schedule attached to this Order.
- 3.2 The amendments referred to in Article 3.1 of this Order of an item in the map-based schedule will have the effect of revoking any provision provided or designated by a previous version of that item in the map-based schedule and not incorporated into the latest version.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order amends existing items in the map-based schedule attached to the Order of 2021, so as to remove a solo motorcycle only bay in Brandon Street to accommodate a new London cycle hire scheme docking station, in the London Borough of Southwark.

1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that it proposes to make the above orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. The effect of the orders would be to accommodate the provision of a new cycle hire docking station on the carriageway (2 metres in width and 18.5 metres in length) which would be maintained by Transport for London and their agents in BRANDON STREET south-west side (north-west of its junction with East Street), by:-
 - (a) removing a solo motorcycle only bay 4 metres in length; and
 - (b) reducing in length by 14.5 metres a 'shared-use' parking place (in which holders of a valid permit for the Controlled Parking Zone 'M2' or paid ticket holders are permitted to park within the permitted hours), 6 metres of the existing 'shared-use' parking place would remain.
3. Southwark Council hereby GIVES FURTHER NOTICE that it proposes to introduce new cycle hire docking stations at the following locations:-
 - (a) on the footway of CAMBERWELL ROAD east side (opposite Nos. 66-70 Albany Road), 2 metres in width and 24.5 metres in length, and aligned parallel to a point 7 metres east of the western edge of the kerb-line; and
 - (b) on the footway of ILDERTON ROAD north-east side (o/s Nos. 1a-1b Ilderton Road), 4 metres in width and 10.5 metres in length, and aligned parallel to a point 6 metres north-east of the south-eastern edge of the kerb-line.

Statement of reasons

London cycle hire scheme docking stations



*The London Borough of Southwark (Charged-for parking places) (Brandon Street) Order 202**
*The London Borough of Southwark (Free parking places) (Brandon Street) Order 202**

This project is part of the Transport for London cycle hire scheme - aimed at improving cycling facilities throughout the city.

This scheme proposes 3 new cycle hire docking stations in the London Borough of Southwark, which would be maintained by Transport for London and their agents, at the following locations:

- (i) in Brandon Street south-west side on the carriageway (north-west of its junction with East Street) 2 metres in width and 18.5 metres in length. To accommodate the new cycle docking station a 'shared-use' parking place in Controlled Parking Zone 'M2' will be reduced in length (6 metres remain) and a solo motorcycle only bay will be removed;
- (ii) on the footway of Camberwell Road (east side opposite Nos. 66-70 Albany Road), 2 metres in width and 24.5 metres in length; and
- (iii) on the footway of Ilderton Road (north-east side o/s Nos. 1a-1b Ilderton Road), 4 metres in width and 10.5 metres in length.

Notes: 'shared-use' refers to parking places in which holders of a valid permit for the CPZ listed or 'pay' paid ticket holders are permitted to park within the permitted hours. All measurements are in metres 'm' and are approximate. Parking charges are listed on www.southwark.gov.uk/parking
