


## Tustin Estate newsletter

## **April 2022**

Welcome to the latest edition of the Tustin Estate monthly newsletter from Southwark Council.

The residents of the Tustin Estate have voted for the demolition and rebuild of Bowness House, Heversham House, Hillbeck Close and Kentmere House, and the refurbishment of the council houses on Manor Grove.



#### **Planning application**

The planning application (reference number 22/AP/1221) for the new homes on the site of the low rise blocks on the Tustin Estate has now been submitted. It can be viewed on Southwark Council's website.

It contains 250 documents, so you can have hours of fun going through them as it not only shows the plans for the new blocks, but also the different individual homes that will be built. In addition there are documents relating to the school, landscape proposals, transport, utilities, fire, energy, heritage and flood risk.

So go to www.southwark.gov.uk and put planning into the search box. Up will come the option Planning Register: search, view and comment on planning applications and then just put the word Tustin in.

Consultation on the designs is not finished as there are still lots of details to work on.

Tustin residents and all other residents within the planning consultation area can submit their views on the application.

The closing date is 10 May 2022.

#### **Construction plan**

On page 2 of this newsletter you will find that Linkcity from Bouygues
Construction, the contractor, has prepared the first draft construction plan for the three phase 1 sites at Hillbeck & Ullswater, next to Heversham and in between Manor Grove.

This is about how they will run the 3 sites where the first new homes will be built and any difficulties that they will face in siting equipment etc. It also sets out that construction work can only take place during the hours set out in the planning application and that no deliveries can take place during drop off and pick up times at Pilgrims' Way School.

### Hillbeck Close and Ullswater House site

The construction plan for this area shows:

- The positioning of the cranes
- The areas where the cranes cannot swing over
- The site accommodation huts for the construction workers
- The vehicle entrance to the site in Hillbeck Close

#### **Next to Heversham House site**

The construction plan for this area shows:

- The positioning of the crane
- The areas where the crane cannot swing over
- The site accommodation huts for the construction workers
- Creating a new vehicle entrance to the site on Ilderton Road

#### In between Manor Grove site

The construction plan for this area shows:

- The temporary vehicle entrance to the site in Manor Grove
- Consent required for the hoarding to protrude on to Manor Grove itself due to the space constraints
- No cranes required on the site as they are low rise homes and will be built traditionally

You can come in and talk to us about your views on the draft construction plan at the next drop-in sessions on Thursday 28 April 2022 between 2pm and 8pm at 801 Old Kent Road and Thursday 12 May 2022 between 2pm and 5pm at 801 Old Kent Road.

#### Hillbeck Close re-housing

Phase 1 requires the residents of Hillbeck Close to be rehoused either temporarily or permanently. So far, there are nine empty properties with another tenant waiting to view a new home.

Last month Hillbeck tenants visited the new homes being built in the bottom of the towers on the Tustin Estate, as Hillbeck tenants will get first choice of the new homes.

Those that are given one of the new homes will then be able to choose whether they want them as their permanent homes or temporary homes, as some residents want to move into the new homes being built as part of the Tustin redevelopment.

#### **Site Surveys**

In preparation for the start of the new homes later this year, ground radar surveys will start in the week commencing Monday 18 April 2022. These surveys are trying to identify where services are run under the estate. In May, the archaeological surveys will begin. It will interesting to see what treasures may be hidden under the Tustin Estate!

#### **Tustin drop in sessions**

The Tustin drop in events for all residents are held twice a month between 2pm and 8pm at 801 Old Kent Road on the first and fourth Thursday of the month.

The next sessions will be on:

- Thursday 28 April 2022
- Thursday 12 May 2022 (this has changed from the previous week as it clashes with the local Council elections and finishes at 5pm)
- Thursday 26 May 2022

There will be no drop in on Thursday 2 June 2022, as that will be the first day of the extended Jubilee Bank Holiday weekend.
