### Solar Panels

Solar panels, also known as PV panels, will be put on the roofs of new homes to help reduce carbon emissions and your energy costs. They are a popular renewable energy source that convert sunlight into electricity. The council will be responsible for maintaining them.

### **Amended Hoarding Plan**

There has been a change to the hoarding plan at Heversham House and Ilderton Road (Plot G1), which has been approved by the London Fire Brigade and was shown at the drop-in on 1 December. The plans will also be on display at the General Meeting being held on Thursday 22 December 2022 at the Tustin Community Hall at the bottom of Windermere Point.

### **Christmas Shutdown**

The Bouygues site will shut over the Christmas period from 23 December 2022 to 3 January 2023. If you see or hear something suspicious on the site during this time, please tell the police or notify the contractor on 0800 0837268.

### **Appropriation**

The council report to take over Phase 1 of the development site under the Housing and Planning Act 2016, has been moved to the cabinet meeting on 17 January 2023.

### Blue badge parking

As requested during the parking meeting in August, the council has changed eight Manor Grove parking bays to disabled bays. The aim is to provide more bays for residents who cannot walk to the new bays between the towers.

### Air source heat pumps at Manor Grove

At Manor Grove, air source heat pumps are proposed for providing heat and hot water, so that the refurbished houses are greener, and .

How do they work? Heat pumps work by taking heat from outside air (even on cold days) and transferring this heat into water, to provide heating and hot water to your home. Heat pumps are very efficient and can produce three times the heat output compared to the electrical input.



What will they look like? Heat pumps vary slightly depending on the manufacturer, but typically they are a small white box with a fan, similar to the picture below. Heat pumps sit outside, and will likely be located in the back garden, against the wall of your home.



#### Will they reduce my energy bills?

Using a heat pump will significantly improve the efficiency and sustainability of your home, which will mean you use less energy. It is difficult to guarantee that your bills will be lower as energy prices keep changing at the moment. Heat pumps do not generate any greenhouse gases, which provides a greener environment for everyone.



### Getting ready to go on the Housing Register

In preparation for tenants in Kentmere House, Heversham House and Bowness House to be rehoused in the new homes that will be built on the Tustin Estate, we are working with them to get registered on the housing list. Thank you to everyone who has come in to see us for help to get registered.

Early in 2023, tenants and resident leaseholders will choose the home they would like to move into. A booklet will show the layout and the size of the property and state the rent and council tax. If you do not contact us to get registered, you may miss out on a chance of choosing your new home. Don't forget you will need this information to complete a housing application:

- National Insurance Number
- Identity please provide 1 form of identity for each adult (18 and above) (NB: if the name is different form the ID, please provide deed poll letter/marriage certificate to show name change):
  - Current British passport
  - o British birth certificate
  - Current passport and/or Immigration documents
  - NB: Non-EU passports must show immigration visa stamp; Residence Permit card (both sides); settled or pre-settled status under the EU Settlement Scheme.
- Address Minimum 5 years of address history has to be shown, which can be achieved through 2 of the following documents showing the current address for each adult (over 18) in the household:
  - Full British driving licence (both sides)
  - College/university confirmation
  - o Recent bank statement
  - Tenancy Agreement (mandatory)
  - Recent phone bill
  - Recent Council Tax bill
  - Pension details
  - Electoral Register entry
  - Educational Maintenance Allowance
  - Recent bill for gas
  - Recent bill/ book for electricity or water supply
  - **P60**
- Medical information if you have a medical need that affects your housing needs - GP details, medication(s), treatment(s), names of hospital(s) attended for health needs, names of any consultants involved in health needs

- Annual Household Income proof of income must be provided from one of the list below:
  - Confirmation from DWP letter showing name and address
  - Recent pay-slip
  - Letter from employer showing name and current address
  - Contract of employment
  - o **P60**
  - Bank statement showing wages
  - Voluntary National Insurance contributions
  - Pay and tax records
  - Recent Self-Assessment Tax return
  - Self-Assessment Employment Tax & National Insurance
- **Community contribution** If you or anyone on your application is currently volunteering for a charity in Southwark or in paid employment, please provide a confirmation letter from the manager. This must state your name and address, the number of hours worked per week and the date you started working.

### Polio immunisations: protect your child today

Experts are worried that polio may be spreading in London. Making sure your children have been fully vaccinated, including an extra booster for 2022, is the best way to protect them.

### Get your winter vaccinations

Vaccines are the best protection we have against viruses like flu and COVID-19 that can cause serious illness this winter. If you're 65 years or over, you are eligible for a free flu vaccine and a COVID-19 booster.

Find out if you're eligible at **nhs.uk/wintervaccinations** and book now.

### Help to prevent spreading COVID-19 and protect yourself

The best way to protect yourself and your loved ones is to:

- Get vaccinated
- Let fresh air in if meeting indoors
- If you have COVID-19 symptoms, try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people
- Wear a face covering, in crowded and enclosed spaces
- Wash your hands or use sanitiser

### Group A Streptococcus: what parents need to know

Group A streptococcus (GAS) is a common bacteria, which can lead to scarlet fever, as well as skin infections and sore throat. Symptoms of scarlet fever include:

- sore throat
- headache
- fever
- nausea
- vomiting
- sandpaper-like rash (harder to see on dark skin but it will still feel rough like sand paper)

Scarlet fever is not usually serious, but should be treated with antibiotics to reduce the risk of complications and spread to others. Go to **111.nhs.uk** or call **111**, or speak to your GP.

On rare occasions, the bacteria can cause an illness called invasive Group A strep (iGAS). While still uncommon, there have been more cases than usual this year, particularly in children under 10.

As a parent, you should trust your own judgement and contact NHS 111 or your GP if your child is getting worse. Call 999 or go to A&E if your child is having difficulty breathing, your child's skin, tongue or lips are blue, or your child is floppy and will not wake up or stay awake.
