THE LONDON BOROUGH OF SOUTHWARK (ELEPHANT AND CASTLE (EAST)) STOPPING UP ORDER (No. 1) 2020

Made this 30th day of July 2020

The London Borough of Southwark ("the Council") makes this Order in exercise of its powers under Section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) ("the Act") and all other enabling powers.

- 1. The Council authorises the stopping up of the areas of highway described in the Schedule to this Order and shown hatched black on the plan attached hereto.
- 2. This Order is made to enable development to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted by the Council on 10 January 2019 under local planning authority reference number 16/AP/4458 for:-

'The phased, mixed-use redevelopment of the existing Elephant and Castle shopping centre and London College of Communication sites comprising the demolition of all existing buildings and structures and redevelopment to comprise buildings ranging in height from single storey to 35 storeys (with a maximum building height of 124.5m AOD) above multilevel and single basements, to provide a range of uses including 979 residential units (use class C3), retail (use Class A1-A4), office (Use Class B1), education (use class D1), assembly and leisure (use class D2) and a new station entrance and station box for use as a London underground operational railway station; means of access, public realm and landscaping works, parking and cycle storage provision, plant and servicing areas, and a range of other associated and ancillary works and structures.'

- 3. This Order shall come into force on the date on which notice that it has been made is first published in accordance with Section 252 (10) of the Act, and may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Elephant and Castle (East)) Stopping Up Order (No. 1) 2020.
- 4. The stopping-up of the highway shall not take effect until a material operation (as defined in section 56(4) of the Act) comprised in the development permitted by planning permission 16/AP/4458 begins to be carried out.
