1. Executive Summary

This report provides the Schools Forum with the details of the mainstream school funding formula for 2023-24. The budgets need to be formally submitted to the Education & Skills Funding Agency (ESFA), using their spreadsheet template called the Authority Proforma Tool (APT), on 20th January 2023. The details of the settlement have been provided in an earlier paper and it is not the intention of this report to reiterate that, but how the funds available should be allocated to schools.

2. Schools Forum Actions

The Schools Forum is asked to:

- I. Agree to set the Minimum Funding Guarantee (MFG) at 0%
- II. To adjust the formula funding rates as necessary to balance the schools block, with reference to the maximum and minimum rates stipulated by the DfE.

3. Background

- 3.1 Each year, every Local Authority is required to submit details of their mainstream school funding formula to the ESFA. The funding formula is based on data provided by the ESFA, although there is some flexibility in the design of the formula and the funding rates, which the Forum are consulted on.
- 3.2 Each Local Authority (LA) receives Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) Schools Block funding from the ESFA via a standard calculation, in principle it is simple, each LA has an individual rate of funding for primary (Southwark's: £6,301.90) and this is multiplied by the numbers of pupils on the previous October census, likewise there is one for Secondary (Southwark's: £8,791.97). Added to this is an element for premises (mainly business rates) and an element for growth in pupils.
- 3.3 The Schools Block funding has to be allocated to schools via a pre-determined formula, although before the funding is distributed, it can be top-sliced with agreement of the Schools Forum, for a growth fund and a falling rolls fund.

- 3.4 Further, a school block transfer can be agreed. The safety valve application to the ESFA that has been considered by the Schools Forum, suggests a £1.2m (0.43%) school block transfer to the high needs block, which is within the 0.5% limit that the Schools Forum can agree without out consulting all schools and seeking the Secretary of State approval.
- 3.5 After any top-slice and/or block transfer, a formula operates to distribute the balance to schools. The criteria on which it is allocated to schools is set by national regulations; the discretion for the Schools Forum is around the rates of funding that are attached to each formula factor.
- 3.6 Sitting over the top of this formula is a protection factor called the Minimum Funding Guarantee (MFG). This provides protection of a school's per pupil rate of funding, but does not protect them against falls in pupils.
- 3.7 The Department of Education (DfE) provides the data that has to be used in the formula.

4 Setting the Minimum Funding Guarantee (MFG)

- 4.1 The MFG is a required part of the allocation calculation the purpose of which is to maintain schools' per pupil funding levels. It does not protect schools from funding reductions caused by drops in pupil numbers. Under the national regulations the MFG rate for 2023/24 can be set between 0.0% and +0.5%. The DfE's expectation is that the MFG rate matches the 0.5% that has been added to schools' NFF funding levels nationally.
- 4.2 The MFG sits over the top of the funding formula and operates on the school allocation provided by the formula. So prior to the MFG all the data changes have to be funded.
- 4.3 The 2022/23 formula included the backdating of a large downward movement of a school's NNDR charge. The backdating is of course once off, which means that this year the amount available for the remainder of the formula has fallen.
- 4.4 Having worked through the above process for 2023-24, the current position on current data is that if we set the MFG at 0.0% we are just short of having sufficient funds to operate the formula.

5 Setting the funding rates

- 5.1 Once all the top slices have be made, data changes incorporated, and mandatory funding rates applied, setting the MFG at 0% leads to the formula over allocating our available funding by £2,607.
- 5.2 The top slices are discussed in other papers on this agenda, and need to be considered alongside this paper. The option put forward by the DfE to deal with a shortfall is to reduce the funding rates in the LA formula.

5.3 The table below shows the differences between our formula rates and the national funding formula rates. It would seem sensible to adjust the rates that are furthest from the national funding formula rates.

The above indicates that either the lump sum or the basic entitlement should be reduced, but the nature of the lump-sum means that any change here has a greater proportional effect. Some of the secondary school's individual IDACI funding rates are higher than the NFF, but when taken together they are lower than the NFF.

Reducing funding rates will only impact schools that are not currently receiving MFG protection. This means the funding rate reduction will be spread across 57 primaries and 2 secondaries.

The overall calculations by funding factor are shown in Appendix A.

6 Funding Models

The draft funding levels by school before any adjustment are shown in Appendix B, as well as the comparable allocation for 2022-23.

Appendix C also provides an estimate of the new additional grant for schools, as these are estimated figures, a cautionary margin of safety of 2% has also be quoted.
