- 1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that on 20 August 2020 it has made the above experimental orders under sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984¹.
- 2. The effects of the experimental orders are to introduce **road closures** which will be physically enforced with traffic signs and the installation of NAL block barriers or planters (see 2a-f) in which any motor vehicle will be prohibited from entering into or proceeding at all times (unless otherwise stated); and any **necessary changes to existing highway restrictions** to accommodate the closures (see 2g-k), in the following streets:

note: 'permit' refers to parking places for holders of valid parking permits within the Parking Zone 'ED'; and 'shared-use' refers to parking places in which holders of a valid permit for 'ED' or paid ticket holders are permitted to park within the hours of operation. A full list of parking charges can be found at www.southwark.gov.uk/parking. All measurements are in metres 'm' and are approximate.

- (a) DERWENT GROVE a point road closure at its junction with Grove Vale;
- (b) EAST DULWICH GROVE no motor vehicles entering or proceeding into Elsie Road from East Dulwich Grove, except for permitted vehicles granted access, from Monday to Friday between the hours of 8.30 am 9.15 am and 3.15 pm 4 pm;
- (c) ELSIE ROAD i) part road closure between its junction with Grove Vale and a point 18 metres south-east of that junction, and ii) a timed 'school street' point road closure at its junction with East Dulwich Grove (in the vicinity of the Goose Green Primary School) which prohibits motor vehicles entering or proceeding into Elsie Road from EAST DULWICH GROVE except for permitted vehicles granted access, from Monday to Friday between the hours of 8.30 am 9.15 am and 3.15 pm 4 pm;
- (d) GROVE VALE no access for motor vehicles, without exception, into Derwent Grove, Elsie Road, Melbourne Grove and Tintagel Crescent at its junctions with those streets;
- (e) MELBOURNE GROVE a point road closure at its junction with Grove Vale;
- (f) TINTAGEL CRESCENT a point road closure at its junction with Grove Vale;
- (g) in MELBOURNE GROVE two existing 'limited stay' disabled persons' parking places (each 6.5m in length) are relocated south-westward, o/s Nos. 1 to 5 Melbourne Grove;
- (h) in DERWENT GROVE an existing 'car club' parking place (6m in length) relocated to the north-eastern side o/s No. 1 Derwent Grove;
- (i) an existing loading bay (9m in length) in ELSIE ROAD south-west side is relocated to the south-eastern side of GROVE VALE o/s Nos. 60 and 62 Grove Vale:
- (j) in Parking Zone 'ED': i) two new 'shared-use' parking places provided in MELBOURNE GROVE south-east side o/s Nos. 5 and 7 Melbourne Grove (7m in length) and north-east side, o/s Nos. 17 and 19 Melbourne Grove (10m in length), and ii) suspends the use of parking places nearest the junction with Grove Vale in the following streets: existing permit holders' parking places in ELSIE ROAD (north-east side 21m) and MELBOURNE GROVE (north-east side 10m, replaced with new 'shared-use'), existing 'shared-use' parking places in DERWENT GROVE (south-west side 10.5m) and TINTAGEL CRESCENT (north-west side 17.5m), and existing 'stop and shop' parking places in DERWENT GROVE (north-east side 8m), ELSIE ROAD (south-west side 9m), MELBOURNE GROVE (south-east side 37m) and TINTAGEL CRESCENT (south-east side 11m); and
- (k) to amend 'at any time' waiting restrictions (double yellow lines) to accommodate changes (see 2g-j) in: i) DERWENT GROVE on both sides, ii) ELSIE ROAD on both sides, iii) GROVE VALE south-east side, iv) MELBOURNE GROVE south-east side, and v) TINTAGEL CRESCENT on both sides.

- 4. The council will in due course be considering whether the provisions of the experimental order/s should be continued in force indefinitely, by means of a permanent order made under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Anyone wishing to question the validity of the order/s or of any provision therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the order/s may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

The decision has been made to introduce **experimental road closures** which will be physically enforced with traffic signs and the installation of NAL block barriers or planters - in which any motor vehicle, will be prohibited from entering into or proceeding; **prescribed routes or turns; to relocate an existing timed 'school street'**, and any **necessary changes to existing highway restrictions** to accommodate the road closures, as part of the London Streetspace programme, in the Goose Green ward London Borough of Southwark.

The Southwark Streetspace Programme aims to repurpose the streets for the local community and businesses and safeguard local streets from a potential increase in traffic as a result of the significant reduction in public transport capacity. One of the key areas that we are looking at as part of this programme is reducing through-traffic on residential streets and creating low-traffic corridors to enable healthy streets for people to walk and cycle and enjoy more space for play and activities.

A summary of the proposed schemes' details are as follows:

Note: All measurements are approximated and in metres 'm'. 'permit bay' refers to parking places for holders of valid parking permits within the Parking Zone 'ED'; and 'shared-use' refers to parking places in which holders of a valid permit for 'ED' or paid ticket holders are permitted to park within the hours of operation. 'DYLs' refer to double yellow lines ('at any time' waiting restrictions) and 'DPPP' refers to Disabled Persons' Parking Places (blue badge holders').

Street	Description
DERWENT GROVE	(i) Introduce a point road closure at its junction with Grove Vale, (ii) existing 'car club' parking place relocated to the north-eastern side o/s No. 1 Derwent Grove, (iii) 'shared-use' and 'stop and shop' bays suspended, and (iv) DYLs added on both sides.
EAST DULWICH GROVE	No access to Elsie Road at its junction: Monday to Friday between the hours of 8.30 am – 9.15 am and 3.15 pm – 4 pm during the timed 'school street' closure.
ELSIE ROAD	(i) Relocated 'school street' closure at its junction with East Dulwich Grove to enable low-traffic neighbourhood operates Monday to Friday between the hours of 8.30 am – 9.15 am and 3.15 pm – 4 pm, (ii) part road closure between its junction with Grove Vale and a point 18 metres south-east of that junction (iii) loading bay relocated to Grove Vale, (iv) permit and 'stop and shop' bays suspended, (v) DYLs added on both sides.

Street	Description
GROVE VALE	(i) No access for motor vehicles, without exception, into Derwent Grove, Elsie Road, Melbourne Grove and Tintagel Crescent – at its junctions with those streets, (ii) loading bay relocated from Elsie Road o/s Nos. 60 and 62 Grove Vale, and (iii) DYLs amended on the south-east side.
MELBOURNE GROVE	(i) Introduce a point road closure at its junction with Grove Vale, (ii) two 'limited stay' DPPPs relocated to o/s Nos. 1 to 5 Melbourne Grove, (iii) two new 'shared-use' bays provided o/s Nos. 5 and 7, 17 and 19 Melbourne Grove, (iv) and suspends permit and 'stop and shop' bays, and (v) DYLs amended on the south-east side.
TINTAGEL CRESCENT	(i) Remove existing timed 'school street' closure (relocated in Elsie Road), (ii) introduce a point road closure at its junction with Grove Vale, (iii) 'shared-use' and 'stop and shop' bays suspended, and (iv) amend DYLs on both sides.

These measures are subject to experimental Traffic Management Orders (TMOs). A TMO is the legal mechanism the council, as traffic authority, uses to control aspects of the way that the highway is used. They provide the legal backing to signs and road markings used on the highway and allow them to be enforceable.

The experimental TMOs will be enforceable for a period up to 18 months to allow the assessment of any impact the road closures and other restrictions might have on the area and surrounding roads, and to revise the scheme if necessary within that time. A review will be carried out to assess the initial success of the scheme and whether the road closure/s and other restrictions should be made permanent.







Suspension of existing Orders

3.1 While this Order remains in force, and without prejudice to the validity of anything done, or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order the designation by the Order of 2013 of the parking place numbered 33 (Melbourne Grove) in Schedule 2 therein, is hereby suspended.

Designation of parking places and application of the Order of 2013 thereto

- Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of a Schedule to this Order is designated as a parking place.
- 4.2 The provisions of the Order of 2013 (other than Articles 3.1 and 14.1) shall apply to each area described in a Schedule to this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a parking place shall include a reference to each area designated as a parking place by this Order and as if any reference to Schedule 1 to the Order of 2013 included a reference to the Schedule to this Order.

Placing of traffic signs etc.

- 5.1 The council shall:-

"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, type and colour prescribed and authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
