- 1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that on 24 September 2020 it has made modifications to the above experimental orders under sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984¹.
- 2. The modifications of the experimental orders are to make certain revisions to the LSP Southwark Bridge Road area trials to accommodate changes to the trial measures in AMERICA STREET, as follows: note: All measurements are in metres 'm' and are approximate.
- (a) removes the trial introduction of 'one-way' north-eastbound operation in the full length of America Street and contra-flow cycle lanes;
- (b) replaces the trial 'no entry' except cycles point at its junction with Southwark Bridge Road with a 'no motorised vehicles' restriction, which includes the exemption for emergency service vehicles, taxis and refuse collection;
- (c) removes the trial relocation of an existing permit holders' parking place in Controlled Parking Zone 'C1' (10m) this parking place on the southern side will remain suspended for the trial; and
- (d) amends existing 'at any time' waiting restrictions (double yellow lines) to accommodate the above parking changes (no additional double yellow lines introduced in this revision, which were not previously introduced during the trial).

- 4. The council will in due course be considering whether the provisions of the experimental order/s should be continued in force indefinitely, by means of a permanent order made under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Anyone wishing to object to the making of the permanent orders or make any other representation regarding the scheme would have 6 months to do so, from the date these modifications come into force. and may send traffic.orders@southwark.gov.uk or to: Traffic Order consultations, Highways, Southwark Council, Environment and Leisure, P.O. Please note that if you wish to object to the scheme you must state the grounds on which your objection is made.
- 6. Under requirements of current access to information legislation, any letter or e-mail sent to the Council in response to this Notice may be subject to publication or disclosure, or both, including communication to other persons affected.
- 7. Anyone wishing to question the validity of the order/s or of any provision therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the order/s may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

Statement of reasons



London Streetspace Programme –

Southwark Bridge Road area modification of existing trials

The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting and loading restrictions) (Amendment No. 10) Experimental Traffic Order 2020

The decision has been made to revise some previous experimental measures as implemented in July 2020 by the London Streetspace Programme – Southwark Bridge area scheme (public notice originally advertised in *the London Gazette* on 16 July 2020¹).

The modifications of the experimental orders are to make certain revisions to the LSP Southwark Bridge Road area trials to accommodate changes to the trial measures in AMERICA STREET (to be advertised on 24 September 2020).

Modifications include:

- (a) remove the trial introduction of 'one-way' north-eastbound operation in the full length of America Street and contra-flow cycle lanes;
- (b) replace the trial 'no entry' except cycles point at its junction with Southwark Bridge Road with a 'no motorised vehicles' restriction, which includes the exemption for emergency service vehicles, taxis and refuse collection;
- (c) remove the trial relocation of an existing permit holders' parking place in Controlled Parking Zone 'C1' (10m) this parking place on the southern side will remain suspended for the trial; and
- (d) amends existing 'at any time' waiting restrictions (double yellow lines) to accommodate the above parking changes (no additional double yellow lines introduced in this revision, which were not previously introduced during the trial).

These measures are modifications to existing experimental Traffic Management Orders (TMOs). A TMO is the legal mechanism the council, as traffic authority, uses to control aspects of the way that the highway is used. They provide the legal backing to signs and road markings used on the highway and allow them to be enforceable.

The experimental TMOs will be enforceable for a period up to 18 months from the original date Made (expires 28 January 2022) to allow the assessment of any impact the road closures and other restrictions might have on the area and surrounding roads, and to revise the scheme if necessary within that time. A review will be carried out to assess the initial success of the scheme and whether the restrictions should be made permanent.


