VARIOUS PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY (NO. 1) ORDER 2000

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and the Regions, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 251 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, has made the above named Order. The effect of the Order will be to extinguish the public right of ways at Denmark Street, Hammon Road and St. Vincent Street and various footpaths within Altrincham and shown zebra hatched and solid black on the map contained in the Order.

It may also be inspected at all reasonable hours at Altrincham Library, Information Office, Stamford New Road, Altrincham.

The Order becomes operative on 1st June 2000, but if any persons aggrieved by the Order wish to question its validity (or the validity of any provision contained in it) on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, or on the ground that any requirements of that Act has not been complied within the relation to the making of the Order, they may, under section 287 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

South Northamptonshire Council

PLANNING (LISTED BUILDINGS AND CONSERVATION
AREAS) ACT 1990, SECTION 69

DEANSHANGER CONSERVATION AREA

Notice is given, under the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Area) Act, section 69, that the South Northamptonshire Council, after consultation with Northamptonshire County Council and Deanshanger Parish Council, has determined, on 18th May 2000, to amend the boundary of the existing Deanshanger Conservation Area as described in the Schedule to this notice.

For those parts of Deanshanger not previously included in the Conservation Area, the effect of conservation area designation is as follows:

1. Conservation area consent will now be required for the demolition of all unlisted buildings (other than excepted buildings) in the area.
 2. Planning applications for development which would in the opinion of the local planning authority affect the character or appearance of the conservation area must be given publicity and representations received as a result of the publicity must be taken into account in determining the application.
 3. It becomes an offence subject to certain expectations to cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage or wilfully destroy any tree in the area except with the consent of the local planning authority.
 4. The local planning authority are now under a duty to formulate and publish proposals for the preservation and enhancement of the area.
- A map of the amended Conservation Area may be inspected, free of charge, during normal office hours at the offices of South Northamptonshire Council (Planning and Leisure Division), Springfields, Towcester, Northamptonshire NN12 6AE.

SCHEDULE

- (A) The Conservation Area is amended by the omission of No. 22 The Green and adjoining paddock together with the modern school building and associated playing fields.
- (B) The Conservation Area is extended by the addition of Holy Trinity Church and the properties along Church Lane together with the landscaped road verge opposite Lodore.
- (C) The Conservation Area is extended by the addition of Willow Green on the north side of Stratford Road.
- (D) The Conservation Area is extended by the addition of properties on either side of High Street between the Church Lane junction and 53 High Street, together with the land between High Street and Church Lane. Note that any wall, fence, railings or hedgerow on the boundary of the Conservation Area shall be included within the Conservation Area.
