PROPOSED STOPPING-UP OF HIGHWAYS AND FOOTPATHS IN MANCHESTER CITY CENTRE

The Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and the Regions hereby gives notice that on the application of Lovells he proposes to make an Order, under section 247 of the above Act, which will authorise the stopping-up of various highways and footpaths at Piccadilly Gardens, Manchester.

If the Order is made, the stopping-up will be authorised only in order to enable the development described in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted to Argent Estates by Manchester City Council, on 28th September 2000, under Ref. 059749/VO/CITY2/00.

THE STOPPING-UP OF HIGHWAYS (SHACKLETON CLOSE, ST. ATHAN, VALE OF GLAMORGAN) ORDER 2000

The Minister for Environment hereby gives notice that she has made an Order, under section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, to authorise the stopping-up of the lengths of highway described in Schedule 1 to this notice.

The stopping-up is authorised only in order to enable the development described in Schedule 2 to this notice to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted by Vale of Glamorgan County Borough Council, on 20th May 1999, under Ref. 99/00346/FUL. The Order shall cease to have effect upon the cessation of the planning permission.

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any of the provisions contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990; or that his or her interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of the Act, that person may, within 6 weeks of 15th December 2000, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
