- Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that on 15 October 2020 it has made the above experimental Orders under sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- 2. The effects of the experimental Orders, are to promote social distancing measures and walking and cycling transport modes and deter out-of-hours and weekend motor vehicle parking and usage in the vicinity of Bermondsey Street retail, hospitality and cultural destinations, as part of the London Streetspace programme, in the following streets:-
- (a) BERMONDSEY STREET (i) introduce contra-flow south-eastbound traffic working for pedal cycles between its junctions with Crucifix Lane and Whites Grounds; (ii) prohibit motor vehicles from entering into or proceeding in that part which lies between its junctions with Whites Grounds and Morocco Street; (iii) prohibit vehicles from entering into Lamb Walk; (iv) prohibit north-westbound vehicles from turning left into Lamb Walk; (v) prohibit vehicles having a length in excess of 10 metres (32' 10") from entering that part north of its junction with Long Lane and Abbey Street, at its junction with Long Lane and Abbey Street - with exemptions for deliveries to the White Cube Gallery; (vi) remove existing 'F' permit holders', solo motor cycle and disabled persons' parking places on both sides between its junctions with Crucifix Lane and Long Lane/Abbey Street and introduce 'at any time' waiting restrictions; (vii) relocate an existing solo motor cycle parking place on the north-west side, north-west of its junction with Long Lane, to the north-west side of an adjoining 'F' permit holders' parking place, extending the existing 'at any time' waiting restrictions at its junction with Long Lane; (viii) convert all existing 'single yellow line' waiting restrictions on both sides between its junctions with Crucifix Lane and Long Lane/Abbey Street to 'at any time'; (ix) introduce 'at any time' loading restrictions on both sides at and on the approach to its junction with Crucifix Lane, between its junctions with Carmarthen Place and Whites Grounds, between its junction with Morocco Street and at and on the southern approach to Tanner Street, and on both sides at and on the approach to Newham's Row; and (x) introduce '7-10 am, 4-7 pm Monday to Sunday' loading restrictions on both sides between a point approx. 41 metres south-east of its junction with Crucifix Lane and its junction with Carmarthen Place;
- (b) LAMB WALK to introduce one-way eastbound traffic working for all vehicles between its junctions with Morocco Street and Bermondsey Street;
- (c) MOROCCO STREET (i) introduce one-way south-westbound traffic working for vehicles other than pedal cycles between its junctions with Bermondsey Street and Leathermarket Street; (ii) prohibit north-eastbound vehicles in that part south of its junction with Lamb Walk from entering into that part north of its junction with Lamb Walk; (iii) introduce a compulsory right turn into Lamb Walk for north-eastbound vehicles in that part south of its junction with Lamb Walk; and (iv) introduce 'at any time' loading restrictions on both sides between its junctions with Bermondsey Street and Leathermarket Street;
- (d) NEWHAM'S ROW to introduce 'at any time' loading restrictions on both sides at its junction with Bermondsey Street;
- (e) TANNER STREET to introduce 'at any time' loading restrictions on both sides at its junction with Bermondsey Street;
- (f) TYERS GATE (i) convert all existing 'single yellow line' waiting restrictions on both sides to 'at any time'; and (ii) introduce 'at any time' loading restrictions on both sides at its junction with Bermondsey Street;
- (g) WHITES GROUNDS (i) prohibit vehicles other than pedal cycles from turning left into Bermondsey Street; (ii) remove an existing 'F' permit holders' parking place and disabled persons' parking place on the south side at its junction with Bermondsey Street and provide a new 'at any time' loading bay, 26 metres in length, in which vehicles may load or unload for up to 40 minutes, no return within 2 hours; (iii) convert 6 metres of an existing permit holders' parking place on the south side outside Nos. 4-8 Whites Grounds to a disabled person's parking place (in which blue badge holders are permitted to stay without time limit); (iv) provide a new 'F' permit holders parking place, 20 metres in length, on the north-west side at its junction with Druid Street; (v) convert all existing 'single yellow line' waiting restrictions on both sides to 'at any time'; and (vi) introduce 'at any time' loading restrictions on both sides at its junction with Bermondsey Street.

The Council will in due course be considering whether the provisions of the experimental Orders should be continued in force indefinitely, by means of a permanent order made under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Anyone wishing to object to the making of the permanent Orders or make any other representation regarding the scheme would have 6 months to do so, from the date the experimental order comes into force (or, if the order is varied by a subsequent order or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, from the date that variation order or modification comes into force), and may send a statement to traffic.orders@southwark.gov.uk or to: Traffic Order consultations, Highways, Southwark Council, Environment and Leisure, P.O. Box 64529, London SE1P 5LX; or use the form labelled 'Parking Road traffic and highway schemes responding to statutory consultation notices' at www.southwark.gov.uk/statutoryconsultationnotices quoting reference 'TMO2021-EXP15\_LSP Bermondsey St'. Please note that if you wish to object to the scheme you must state the grounds on which your objection is made.
- 6. Under requirements of current access to information legislation, any letter or e-mail sent to the Council in response to this Notice may be subject to publication or disclosure, or both, including communication to other persons affected.
- 7. Anyone wishing to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

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## London Streetspace Programme – Bermondsey Street area

The London Borough of Southwark (Free parking places) (Disabled persons) (No. 4) Experimental Traffic Order 2020 The London Borough of Southwark (Free parking places) (Solo motor cycles) (No. 2) Experimental Traffic Order 2020 The London Borough of Southwark (Parking places) (CPZ 'F') (No. 4) Experimental Traffic Order 2020 The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed Routes) (Bermondsey Street area) Experimental Traffic Order 2020 The London Borough of Southwark (Loading bays) (No. 6) Experimental Traffic Order 2020 The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting and loading restrictions) (Amendment No. 18) Experimental Traffic Order 2020

The decision has been made to introduce a series experimental measures the intention of which is to promote social distancing measures and walking and cycling transport modes and deter out-of-hours and weekend motor vehicle parking and usage in the vicinity of Bermondsey Street retail, hospitality and cultural destinations, as part of the London Streetspace programme, in the London Borough of Southwark

The Southwark Streetspace Programme aims to repurpose the streets for the local community and businesses and safeguard local streets from a potential increase in traffic as a result of the significant reduction in public transport capacity. One of the key areas that the Council is looking at as part of this programme is reducing the volume of traffic in the area and creating low-traffic corridors to enable healthy streets for people to walk and cycle and enjoy more space for local leisure activities.

These measures are subject to experimental Traffic Management Orders (TMOs). A TMO is the legal mechanism the council, as traffic authority, uses to control aspects of the way that the highway is used. They provide the legal backing to signs and road markings used on the highway and allow them to be enforceable.


The experimental TMOs will be enforceable for a period up to 18 months to allow the assessment of any impact the restrictions might have on the area and surrounding roads, and to revise the scheme if necessary within that time. A review will be carried out to assess the initial success of the scheme and whether the restrictions should be made permanent.



#### The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Bermondsey Street area) Experimental Traffic Order 2020

Made: 15 October 2020 Coming into force: 22 October 2020 Expires: 25 April 2022

The Council of the London Borough of Southwark, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984<sup>a</sup>, as amended, and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following Order:

#### Citation, commencement and expiry

1.1 This Order may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Bermondsey Street area) Experimental Traffic Order 2020, shall come into force on 22 October 2020, and will expire on 25 April 2022.

#### Interpretation

2.1 In this Order:-

causing includes permitting;

"council" means the Council of the London Borough of Southwark;

"pedal cycle" has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016<sup>b</sup>;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

"motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; and

"prescribed street" for the purposes of Article 5.2 of this Order means a street or part thereof referred to in Article 4.3 of this Order.

2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.

#### Amendment of existing Orders

- 3.1 Whilst this Order remains in force and without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order:-
  - (a) the Southwark (Prescribed Routes) (No. 4) Traffic Order 1967<sup>c</sup> shall have effect as though item 2(a) in Schedule 1 thereto were omitted; and
  - (b) the Southwark (Prescribed Routes) (Various Streets) (No. 3) Traffic Order 2011<sup>d</sup> shall have effect as though Article 3.2 therein were omitted.

#### Prescribed routes

- 4.1 No person shall cause any vehicle other than a pedal cycle to proceed that part of Bermondsey Street which lies between the southern kerb-line of White's Grounds and the south-western kerb-line of Crucifix Lane in a direction other than from south-east to north-west.
- 4.2 No person causing any vehicle other than a pedal cycle to proceed in a westbound direction in White's Grounds shall, upon reaching its junction with Bermondsey Street, cause that vehicle to turn left into Bermondsey Street.
- 4.3 No person shall cause any motor vehicle to enter into or proceed in that length of Bermondsey Street which lies between the southern kerb-line of White's Grounds and the north-western kerb-line of Morocco Street.
- 4.4 No person shall cause any vehicle other than a pedal cycle to proceed in that part of Morocco Street which lies between the south-western kerb-line of Bermondsey Street and a point 22 metres south-west of that kerb-line in a direction other than from north-east to south-west.
- 4.5 No person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in that part of Morocco Street which lies between the southern kerb-line of Leathermarket Street and the north-eastern kerb-line of Lamb Walk in a direction other than from north-east to south-west.
- 4.6 No person causing any vehicle to proceed in that part of Morocco Street which lies to the southwest of its junction with Lamb Walk shall cause that vehicle to enter into that part of Morocco Street while lies to the north-east of its junction with Lamb Walk;
- 4.7 Every person causing any vehicle to proceed in a north-eastbound direction in that part of Morocco Street which lies to the south-west of its junction with Lamb Walk shall, upon reaching its junction with Lamb Walk, cause that vehicle to turn right into Lamb Walk.
- 4.8 No person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in Lamb Walk in a direction other than from west to east;
- 4.9 No person causing any vehicle to proceed in Bermondsey Street shall, upon reaching its junction with Lamb Walk, cause that vehicle to enter into Lamb Walk.
- 4.10 No person causing any vehicle to proceed in a north-westbound direction in Bermondsey Street shall, upon reaching its junction with Lamb Walk, cause that vehicle to turn left into Lamb Walk.
- 4.11 No person shall cause any vehicle or combination of vehicles exceeding 10.0 metres (32 feet 10 inches) in length proceeding in either Abbey Street, or Long Lane, or that length of Bermondsey Street which lies to the south of its junction with Abbey Street and Long Lane, to enter into or proceed in that length of Bermondsey Street which lies to the north of its junction with Abbey Street and Long Lane.

#### Exemptions

- 5.1 Nothing in Articles 4.1 to 4.11 of this Order shall apply in relation to:-
  - (a) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or
  - (b) any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency; or
  - (c) any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- 5.2 Nothing in Article 4.3 of this Order shall apply in relation to any vehicle being used in connection with the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or adjacent to a prescribed street of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity, or of any electronic communications network (as defined in section 32 of the Communications Act 2003<sup>e</sup>); or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign, if the vehicle cannot be used for that purpose in any other street or part thereof.
- 5.3 Nothing in Article 4.11 of this Order shall apply in relation to:-
  - (a) any vehicle which is entering into Bermondsey Street, where necessary for the purpose of the delivery or collection of artworks, materials or goods to or from the White Cube Gallery Bermondsey; or
  - (b) any vehicle being used by the Council's Waste Management Team or their contractors for the purpose of refuse collection.

#### Power to modify or suspend this Order

6.1 In pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Parking and Network Management Business Unit Manager (or such other officer of the Council as holds the post of Traffic Manager as defined in section 17 of the Traffic Management Act 2004<sup>f</sup>) may, if it appears to him or to that officer essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway, or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by this Order runs, modify or suspend any provision of this Order, save that no modification shall make an addition.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

#### (This note is not part of the Order)

This Order, by way of an experiment:-

- (i) provides contra-flow south-eastbound traffic working for pedal cycles in Bermondsey Street between its junctions with Crucifix Lane and White's Grounds;
- (ii) prohibits vehicles other than pedal cycles in White's Grounds from turning left into Bermondsey Street;
- (iii) prohibits motor vehicles from entering into or proceeding in Bermondsey Street between its junctions with White's Grounds and Morocco Street;
- (iv) introduces one-way south-westbound traffic working for vehicles other than pedal cycles in Morocco Street between its junctions with Bermondsey Street and Leathermarket Street;
- (v) introduces one-way south-westbound traffic working for all vehicles in Morocco Street between its junctions with Leathermarket Street and Lamb Walk;
- (vi) prohibits north-eastbound vehicles in that part of Morocco Street which lies to the south-west of its junction with Lamb Walk from entering into that part of Morocco Street which lies to the north-east of its junction with Lamb Walk;
- (vii) introduces a compulsory right turn into Lamb Walk for north-eastbound vehicles in that part of Morocco Street which lies to the south-west of its junction with Lamb Walk;
- (viii) introduces one-way eastbound traffic working for all vehicles in Lamb Walk;
- (ix) prohibits vehicles in Bermondsey Street from entering into Lamb Walk;
- (x) prohibits north-westbound vehicles in Bermondsey Street from turning left into Lamb Walk; and
- (xi) prohibits vehicles in excess of 10.0 metres (32' 10") in length from entering into that part of Bermondsey Street which lies to the north of its junction with Abbey Street and Long Lane, with certain exemptions;

#### Citation, commencement and expiry

1.1 This Order may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Loading bays) (No. 6) Experimental Traffic Order 2020, shall come into force on 22 October 2020 and will expire on 25 April 2022.

#### Interpretation

2.1 In this Order:-

"council" means the Council of the London Borough of Southwark;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment; and

"the Order of 2016" means the London Borough of Southwark (Loading bays) (No. 1) Order 2016<sup>b</sup>, as amended.

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2016 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

#### Designation of loading bay and application of the Order of 2016 thereto

- 3.1 Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order and bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway, is designated as a loading bay.
- 3.2 The provisions of the Order of 2016 (other than Articles 3.1 and 12.1) shall apply to each area designated as a loading bay by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a loading bay shall include a reference to each area designated as a loading bay by this Order and as if any reference to Schedule 1 to the Order of 2016 included a reference to the Schedule to this Order.

#### Placing of traffic signs etc.

- 4.1 The council shall:-
  - (a) place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each loading bay referred to in the Schedule to this Order;
  - (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each loading bay referred to in the Schedule to this Order traffic signs indicating that such a loading bay may be used during the permitted hours for the loading and unloading only of the vehicles specified in Article 4.1 of the Order of 2016; and
  - (c) carry out such other works as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a loading bay.

#### Power to modify or suspend this Order

5.1 In pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Parking and Network Management Business Unit Manager (or such other officer of the Council as holds the post of Traffic Manager as defined in section 17 of the Traffic Management Act 2004<sup>c</sup>) may, if it appears to him or to that officer essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway, or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by this Order runs, modify or suspend any provision of this Order, save that no modification shall make an addition.

- (i) introduces new lengths of 'at any time' waiting restrictions in Bermondsey Street and White's Grounds;
- (ii) introduces new lengths of 'at any time' loading restrictions in Bermondsey Street, Leathermarket Street, Morocco Street, Newham's Row, Tanner Street, Tyer's Gate and White's Grounds; and
- (iii) introduces new lengths of 7 am to 10 am, 4 pm to 7 pm, Monday to Sunday loading restrictions in Bermondsey Street;

as part of the London Streetspace Programme, in the London Borough of Southwark.
