- 2. The effects of the order would be to add new limited stay Disabled Persons' Parking Places (DPPP) 6.6 metres in length in which only vehicles displaying a valid disabled persons 'blue badge' are permitted at any time (max stay 4 hrs and no return within 2 hrs), in:-
  - (a) COURT LANE, south-west side outside No. 126 Court Lane; and
  - (b) GILKES CRESCENT, south-west side north-west of its junction with Calton Avenue.





The council of the London Borough of Southwark, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984<sup>a</sup>, as amended, and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following Order:

#### Citation and commencement

1.1 This Order may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Free parking places) (Disabled persons) (No. \*) Order 20\*\* and shall come into force on xx xxxxxxxx 20\*\*.

#### Interpretation

2.1 In this Order:-

"council" means the council of the London Borough of Southwark;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

"the Order of 2013" means The London Borough of Southwark (Free parking places) (Disabled persons) (No. 1) Order 2013<sup>b</sup>, as amended.

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2013 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

#### Designation of parking places and application of the Order of 2013 thereto

- 3.1 Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of a Schedule to this Order is designated as a parking place.
- 3.2 The provisions of the Order of 2013 (other than Articles 3.1 and 14.1) shall apply to each area described in a Schedule to this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a parking place shall include a reference to each area designated as a parking place by this Order and as if any reference to Schedule 2 to the Order of 2013 included a reference to the Schedule to this Order.

#### Placing of traffic signs etc.

- 4.1 The council shall:-
  - (a) place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each parking place referred to in the Schedule to this Order;
  - (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place referred to in the Schedule to this Order traffic signs indicating that such parking places may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 4.1 of the Order of 2013; and
  - (c) carry out such other works as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.
