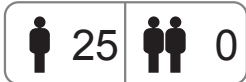

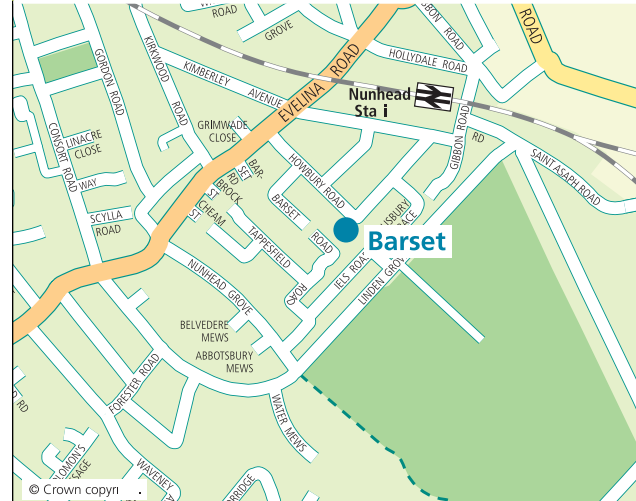

Barset is a beautiful residential unit, which is located in the heart of residential Nunhead.

The scheme boasts a lively atmosphere. There are evening bingo nights, coffee mornings and fish suppers in the residents lounge. The lounge, which contains a television and comfortable chairs and tables, is at the

centre of the scheme and Barset's social committee meets here regularly.

A large courtyard garden with a lawn, plants and vegetables is located at the centre of the complex. Here residents can sit out on tables and chairs and enjoy the peace of the garden.

The scheme is close to Peckham Rye Park and Common which is currently being restored to its former Edwardian glory. Within the park is Sexby Gardens, a formal garden complete with rose pergolas.





### 📍 Areas of interest

Nearby Nunhead Cemetery is perhaps the least well known, but most attractive, of the great Victorian Cemeteries of London. It contains examples of the magnificent monuments erected in memory of the most eminent citizens of the day.
