




Activities



Areas of interest A five minute walk to the River Thames, Lucy Brown is within walking distance of Borough Market, Southwark Cathedral and the City of London, and a short trip to the Southbank, New Tate Gallery and Globe Theatre.





The Lucy Brown sheltered scheme is located just around the corner from Borough High Street, with its bustling market, shops and pubs. The scheme's busy social agenda reflects the liveliness of life outside the scheme's doors.

The heart of the scheme is its large communal lounge where residents gather for activities, or simply to sit and talk. The lounge looks out upon a spacious courtyard garden with a fountain.

Borough itself divides historic Southwark in two. Borough High Street was originally the Roman road Watling Street and in the medieval period was the site of famous Inns. Borough is now a thriving cosmopolitan area of London, with many restaurants, bars and, of course, the world famous Borough Market.

O Tube: A short walk to London Bridge (Northern, Jubilee) tube station

Buses: 21, 133, 343 – London Bridge, Lewisham, Liverpool Street, Streatham, New Cross Gate. 35,40, C10 – Borough High Street Canada Water, Victoria, Aldgate, Dulwich, Shoreditch, Clapham Junction.

Trains: Round the corner from London Bridge train station and a fifteen minute walk across the river to Cannon Street.

A local chemist and paper shop deliver directly to tenants. There is a local post office on Borough High Street. The scheme is also just around the corner from world famous Borough Market with its selection of wholesale and exotic fruit and vegetables, cheeses, meat, fish, sausages and bread.

Situated in the heart of Southwark, Rockgrove Way is located between Borough and Rotherhithe, in the south of Bermondsey.




There is a new social event every day at

Marden Square is part of a seven storey open block of flats that forms an integrated part of a

larger housing estate. It has access to the first floor by stairs and a lift from the public footpath below on Drummond Road. With flats on the first and second floor it has communal walkways that lead to individual flats. It is unique as the only open unit in the estate, and is distinguishable from the rest of the block by its doors on both floors for added extra security. Marden Square truly promotes the ethos of independent living.

Linking both Jamaica Road and Southwark Park Road it is 10 minutes away from local shopping areas and at the top and bottom of Drummond Road, with Southwark Park being close by.

It is ideally centred between sister units Keetons and Rockgrove, both being 10-15 minutes walk away.
