	Programme is still scheduled to start on site at the end of October 2012. 34 week contact completing Jun 2013.
	Questions were being raised but discussions on this matter were best left to the leaseholder meetings being scheduled. Leaseholder will have option to pay, elderly can place the charge on the property, when the property is sold the Council will recover the charge.
