 - (i) DERWENT GROVE north-east side o/s No. 1 (6m), (ii) ELSIE ROAD north-east side south of its junction with Grove Vale (6m), (iii) GROVE VALE south side opp. Nos. 73 to 79 (19m), and (iv) MELBOURNE GROVE south-east side o/s No. 1c (10m) and north-west side o/s Melbourne Terrace (15m); and
- (b) to introduce 'shared-use' parking places in which holders of a valid CPZ 'ED' permit or where the parking charge has been paid, are permitted to park during Mon-Fri 8.30 am to 6.30 pm (max stay 2hrs, no return within 2hrs) in:-
 - (i) DERWENT GROVE south-west side o/s Nos. 2 to 4 (6m), and (ii) ELSIE ROAD south-west side south of its junction with Grove Vale (6m).
 - note: All measurements are in metres 'm' and are approximate. Parking charges are listed on www.southwark.gov.uk/parking

Statement of reasons

London Streetspace Programme – East Dulwich area additional trial measures



The London Borough of Southwark (LSP East Dulwich) (Map-based) (No. 2) Experimental Traffic Order 2021

The decision has been made to introduce new parking areas by way of an experiment, in the East Dulwich area (Goose Green ward), in the London Borough of Southwark.

The introduction of additional pay or 'shared-use' parking in the East Dulwich area, as detailed below, complement the low-traffic neighbourhood measures in Dulwich where the overall objectives are to reduce traffic, encourage active travel and support local businesses. East Dulwich is within an existing Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ), 'ED'.

Additional parking will include:-

'pay' parking places where the parking charge has been paid, vehicles are permitted park during Mon-Sat 8.30 am to 6.30 pm (max stay 2hrs, no return within 2hrs) in:

- Derwent Grove north-east side o/s No. 1 (6m);
- Elsie Road north-east side (6m);
- Grove Vale south side opp. Nos. 73 to 79 (19m); and
- Melbourne Grove south-east side o/s No. 1c (10m) and north-west side o/s Melbourne Terrace (15m)

'shared-use' parking places in which holders of a valid CPZ 'ED' permit or where the parking charge has been paid, are permitted to park during Mon-Fri 8.30 am to 6.30 pm (max stay 2hrs, no return within 2hrs) in:

- Derwent Grove south-west side o/s Nos. 2 to 4 (6m);
- Elsie Road south-west side (6m);

note: All measurements are in metres 'm' and are approximate. Parking charges are listed on www.southwark.gov.uk/parking

These measures are subject to experimental Traffic Management Orders (TMOs). A TMO is the legal mechanism the council, as traffic authority, uses to control aspects of the way that the highway is used. They provide the legal backing to signs and road markings used on the highway and allow them to be enforceable.

The experimental TMO will be enforceable for a period up to 18 months to allow the assessment of any impact the restrictions might have on the area and surrounding roads, and to revise the scheme if necessary within that time. A review will be carried out to assess the initial success of the scheme and whether the restrictions should be made permanent.

The decision has been made to revise the previous experimental road closures as implemented in August 2020 (LSP East Dulwich public notice originally advertised in the London Gazette on 20 August 2020¹).

The modifications of the experimental order are to make certain revisions to the London Streetspace Programme – East Dulwich area trials, in the London Borough of Southwark by reducing or removing the following trial measures:-

- (a) DERWENT GROVE north-east side outside Nos. 3 to 9 Derwent Grove, reduce in length the CPZ 'ED' permit holders' only parking place by 6 metres (23.5 metres of permit parking remain); and
- (b) remove 'at any time' waiting restrictions (double yellow lines) in:
 - (i) ELSIE ROAD on both sides between a point 17 metres south-east of its junction with Grove Vale and a point 23 metres south-east of that junction (6 metres per side),
 - (ii) GROVE VALE south side, opposite Nos. 65 to 79 Grove Vale (19 metres), and
 - (iii) MELBOURNE GROVE south-east side, outside Nos. 1c Melbourne Grove (10 metres).

These measures are modifications to existing experimental Traffic Management Orders (TMOs).

A TMO is the legal mechanism the council, as traffic authority, uses to control aspects of the way that the highway is used. They provide the legal backing to signs and road markings used on the highway and allow them to be enforceable.

The experimental TMO will be enforceable for a period up to 18 months from the original date Made (expires 7 March 2022) to allow the assessment of any impact the road closures and other restrictions might have on the area and surrounding roads, and to revise the scheme if necessary within that time. A review will be carried out to assess the initial success of the scheme and whether the road closure/s and other restrictions should be made permanent.

- "the parking Order of 2021" means the London Borough of Southwark (Charged-For Parking Places) (Map-based) Order 2021^b, and "the WLSR Order of 2021" means the London Borough of Southwark (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Map-based) Order 2021^c.
- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the parking Order of 2021 shall have the same meaning as in that Order, and any expression used in this Order which is also used in the WLSR Order of 2021 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Amendments

Power to modify or suspend this Order

4.1 In pursuance of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Head of Service - Highways (or such other officer of the council as holds the post of Traffic Manager as defined in the Traffic Management Act 2004^d), may modify or suspend any provision of this Order, save that no modification shall make an addition, if it appears to them essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic; or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway; or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by this Order runs.

- (b) the implementation of this Experimental Order shall change in name any previous Orders enacted by the London Borough of Southwark in relation to any restrictions represented in this Order and make no material change to any existing restriction; and
- (c) those existing trial restrictions enacted by way of an experiment, as listed below, will continue to progress through to the evaluation and completion of each scheme: part of the London Streetspace Programme East Dulwich, by way of an
 - (i) suspends the use of 'limited stay' disabled persons parking places in Melbourne Grove to relocate the places further south-west from the junction with Grove Vale:
 - (ii) relocates an existing car club parking place in Derwent Grove to the northeast side;

"map schedule legend" means the map schedule legend attached to this Order which, when used in conjunction with the map-based schedule, identifies the specific type of parking places designated by this Order and, where appropriate, certain of their governing provisions; and

Designation of parking place and application of the Order of 2021 thereto

- 4.1 Each area on a street identified the map based schedule as a parking place and, where applicable, by way of the map schedule legend as an area marked out and signed for the use therein of specified classes of vehicles following the conditions specified in the Order of 2021 in relation to that type of parking place, is designated as a parking place.
- 4.2 Unless otherwise so identified, a parking place shall be bounded on one side of its length by the edge of the carriageway and be an area marked either by a traffic sign or by another method of indicating the extent of a parking place as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016°.
- 4.3 The provisions of the Order of 2021 (other than Articles 4 and 19) shall apply to the area designated as a parking place by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a parking place included a reference to an area designated as a parking place by this Order.

Placing of traffic signs, etc

- 5.1 The Council shall:
 - (a) place and maintain traffic signs or other appropriate markings on the surface of the street indicating the limits of the parking place designated by this Order;
 - (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place, traffic signs indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Articles 5.1, 5.3 and 5.5 of the Order of 2021;
 - (c) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of the parking place a traffic sign indicating, that such parking place may be used by vehicles making payment of the parking charge by way of the electronic payment system; and the location identification number of such parking place or part thereof; and
 - (d) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purpose of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.

Power to modify or suspend this Order

6.1 In pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Head of Service - Highways (or such other officer of the Council as holds the post of Traffic Manager as defined in section 17 of the Traffic Management Act 2004^d) may, if it appears to that officer essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway, or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by this Order runs, modify or suspend any provision of this Order, save that no modification shall make an addition.

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order, by way of an experiment adds or substitutes items in the map-based schedule attached to the Order of 2021, so as to provide new parking places in CPZ 'ED':-

- a) in Derwent Grove convert existing 'permit' i) on north-east side o/s No. 1 to 'pay' (6m), and ii) on south-west side o/s Nos. 2 to 4 to 'shared-use' (10m)
- b) add 'pay' (Mon-Sat 8.30 am-6.30 pm max stay 2hrs, no rtn 2hrs) in Elsie Road north-east side (6m), Grove Vale south side opp. Nos. 73 to 79 (19m), and Melbourne Grove south-east side o/s No. 1c (10m) and north-west side o/s Melbourne Terrace (15m); and
- c) add 'shared-use' (Mon-Fri 8.30 am-6.30 pm max stay 2hrs, no rtn 2hrs) in Elsie Road southwest side (6m),

in the London Borough of Southwark.
