The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (LSP Walworth revocations) (No. 3) Order 2021

The decision has been made to revise the previous experimental road closures as implemented in September 2020 by the London Streetspace Programme - Walworth scheme (LSP Walworth 3 - public notice originally advertised in *the London Gazette* on 24 September 2020¹) and to revise certain measures of the trial as LSP Walworth phase 4 (to be advertised on 8 July 2021).

The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Penton Place area) Experimental Traffic Order 2020 The decision has been made to revise the previous experimental measures as implemented in September 2020 by the London Streetspace Programme - Walworth scheme, in the London Borough of Southwark (LSP Walworth 3 - public notice originally advertised in *the London Gazette* on 24 September 2020¹).

The modifications of the experimental order are to make certain revisions to the London Streetspace Programme – Walworth trials, by removing the trial introductions of a point road closure in Amelia Street only, within the Penton Place area. The Amelia Street road closure will be reinstated as a new trial part road closure to facilitate changes to the London Streetspace Programme - Walworth scheme overall.

These measures are modifications to existing experimental Traffic Management Orders (TMOs). A TMO is the legal mechanism the council, as traffic authority, uses to control aspects of the way that the highway is used. They provide the legal backing to signs and road markings used on the highway and allow them to be enforceable.

The experimental TMO will be enforceable for a period up to 18 months from the original date Made (expires 7 March 2022) to allow the assessment of any impact the road closures and other restrictions might have on the area and surrounding roads, and to revise the scheme if necessary within that time. A review will be carried out to assess the initial success of the scheme and whether the road closure/s and other restrictions should be made permanent.

Iliffe Street

- 3.1 No person causing any motor vehicle to proceed in that part of Iliffe Street which lies north-east of a point 2.5 metres north-east of the north-eastern kerb-line of Penton Place shall, upon reaching that point, cause that motor vehicle to enter or proceed in that part of Iliffe Street which lies south-west of a point 2.5 metres north-east of the north-eastern kerb-line of Penton Place.
- 3.2 No person causing any motor vehicle to proceed in that part of Iliffe Street which lies south-west of a point 2.5 metres north-east of the north-eastern kerb-line of Penton Place shall, upon reaching that point, cause that motor vehicle to enter or proceed in that part of Iliffe Street which lies north-east of a point 2.5 metres north-east of the north-eastern kerb-line of Penton Place.

Penton Place the north-westernmost north-west to south-east arm

- 4.1 No person causing any motor vehicle to proceed in that part of Penton Place which lies north-west of a point 6 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerb-line of Kennington Park Road shall, upon reaching that point, cause that motor vehicle to enter or proceed in that part of Penton Place which lies south-east of a point 6 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerb-line of Kennington Park Road.
- 4.2 No person causing any motor vehicle to proceed in that part of Penton Place which lies southeast of a point 6 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerb-line of Kennington Park Road shall, upon reaching that point, cause that motor vehicle to enter or proceed in that part of Penton Place which lies north-west of a point 6 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerb-line of Kennington Park Road.
- 4.3 No person causing any vehicle to proceed in a north-westward direction in the north-westernmost north-west to south-east arm of Penton Place shall, upon reaching its junction with Amelia Street, cause that vehicle to turn right into Amelia Street.
- 4.4 No person causing any vehicle to proceed in a south-eastward direction in the north-westernmost north-west to south-east arm of Penton Place shall, upon reaching its junction with Amelia Street, cause that vehicle to turn left into Amelia Street.
- 4.5 No person causing any vehicle to proceed in a north-westward direction in the north-westernmost north-west to south-east arm of Penton Place shall, upon reaching its junction with Iliffe Street, cause that vehicle to turn right into Iliffe Street.
- 4.6 No person causing any vehicle to proceed in a south-eastward direction in the north-westernmost north-west to south-east arm of Penton Place shall, upon reaching its junction with Iliffe Street, cause that vehicle to turn left into Iliffe Street.
- 4.7 Nothing in Articles 4.3, 4.4, 4.5 and 4.6 above shall apply to a pedal cycle.

Exemptions

- 5.1 Nothing in Articles 3.1, 3.2, 4.3, 4.4, 4.5 and 4.6 above shall apply in relation to:-
 - (a) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform;
 - (b) any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency;
 - (c) any vehicle being used for the purpose of refuse collection, maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, cleansing or lighting of that part of street; and
 - (d) any vehicle being used in connection with the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or adjacent to that part of street of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity, or of any electronic communications network; or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign, if the vehicle cannot be used for that purpose in any other street or part of street.

Power to modify or suspend this Order

6.1 In pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Road Network and Parking Business Unit Manager (or such other officer of the council as holds the post of Traffic

Manager as defined in section 17 of the Traffic Management Act 2004^d) may, if it appears to that officer essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway, or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by this Order runs, modify or suspend any provision of this Order, save that no modification shall make an addition.

The decision has been made to revise the previous experimental road closures as implemented in September 2020 by the London Streetspace Programme - Walworth scheme (LSP Walworth 3 - public notice originally advertised in *the London Gazette* on 24 September 2020¹) and to revise certain measures of the trial as LSP Walworth phase 4 (to be advertised on 8 July 2021).

The Amelia Street closure and the Cooks Road closure and associated changes to existing highway restrictions have been separated and re-made in entirety as new trials to convert the point road closures to part road closures.

Summary of the full effects to be made by way of an experiment:

To convert the previously implemented point road closures at Amelia Street and Cooks Road to part road closures at these locations:

- Amelia Street between its junction with Penton Place and a point 13 metres north-east of that junction, and
- Cooks Road between its junction with Fleming Road/Otto Street and a point 27 metres southeast of that junction

The road closures will prohibit the movement of motor vehicles, which include the exemption for taxis, emergency service vehicles, and refuse collection.

The Cooks Road closure will also require some parking and waiting restrictions to be amended. Cooks Road (south-west side between its junctions with Otto Street and Forsyth Gardens) the use of 17 metres of an existing 'E' permit holders parking place will be suspended (26.5 metres of permit parking remain), and 'at any time' waiting restrictions (double yellow lines) will replace the above-mentioned parking.

A TMO is the legal mechanism the council, as traffic authority, uses to control aspects of the way that the highway is used. They provide the legal backing to signs and road markings used on the highway and allow them to be enforceable.

London Streetspace Programme – Walworth 4 revisions to East Street area trials



The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (East Street area) (No. 3) Experimental Traffic Order 2021 The London Borough of Southwark (Charged-for parking places) (East Street area) Experimental Traffic Order 2021 The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting, loading and stopping restrictions) (East Street area) Experimental Traffic Order 2021

The decision has been made to revise the previous experimental road closures as implemented in September 2020 by the London Streetspace Programme - Walworth scheme (LSP Walworth 3 - public notice originally advertised in *the London Gazette* on 24 September 2020¹) and to revise certain measures of the trial as <u>LSP Walworth phase 4</u> (to be advertised on 8 July 2021).

The East Street area trials have been separated and re-made in entirety as a new trial, the addition of 'at any time' loading restrictions, and the amendment to waiting restrictions have been included.

The full effects for the trial are:

- in Blackwood Street (i) to introduce a part road closure between its junctions with East Street and Bronti Close prohibiting the movement of motor vehicles, which includes the exemption for emergency service vehicles, and refuse collection, (ii) the north-east side suspend the use of an existing CPZ 'M2' 'shared-use' parking place (12.5m in length), and (iii) add new 'at any time' loading restrictions (double kerb blips).
- in Walworth Place (i) to introduce a part road closure between its junctions with East Street and Bronti Close, prohibiting the movement of motor vehicles, which includes the exemption for emergency service vehicles, refuse collection and vehicles requiring access to East Street premises during the market trading hours (Tuesday to Sunday between the hours of 6.30 am 9 am and 3 pm 6 pm), (ii) suspend the use of two existing CPZ 'M2' 'shared-use' parking places north-east side (20.5m in length) and south-east side (6m in length), and (iii) add new 'at any time' loading restrictions (double kerb blips).
- to add new 'at any time' loading restrictions (double kerb blips) in Bronti Close and East Street at junctions with Blackwood Street and Walworth Place.
- to add and amend waiting restrictions (yellow lines) in Blackwood Street and Walworth Place in the above locations.

These measures are subject to experimental Traffic Management Orders (TMOs).

A TMO is the legal mechanism the council, as traffic authority, uses to control aspects of the way that the highway is used. They provide the legal backing to signs and road markings used on the highway and allow them to be enforceable.

The experimental TMOs will be enforceable for a period up to 18 months to allow the assessment of any impact the restrictions might have on the area and surrounding roads, and to revise the scheme if necessary within that time. A review will be carried out to assess the initial success of the scheme and whether the restrictions should be made permanent.





The decision has been made to amend waiting restrictions and parking places in Controlled Parking Zones 'E' and 'M2' in the Walworth area, as part of the London Streetspace Programme, and to complement the low-traffic neighbourhood measures in Walworth (North Walworth ward and Newington ward), in the London Borough of Southwark.

The changes to waiting restrictions and parking in the Walworth area, as detailed below, complement the low-traffic neighbourhood measures in Walworth where the overall objectives are to reduce traffic, encourage active travel and support local businesses.

Summary of new trial measures:

- (a) in Lytham Street (within CPZ 'M2') north-west side o/s Nos. 3 to 21 Lytham Street, replace 42 metres of existing 'shared-use' parking place with 'at any time' waiting restrictions;

These measures are subject to experimental Traffic Management Orders (TMOs). A TMO is the legal mechanism the council, as traffic authority, uses to control aspects of the way that the highway is used. They provide the legal backing to signs and road markings used on the highway and allow them to be enforceable.

The experimental TMOs will be enforceable for a period up to 18 months to allow the assessment of any impact the restrictions might have on the area and surrounding roads, and to revise the scheme if necessary within that time. A review will be carried out to assess the initial success of the scheme and whether the restrictions should be made permanent.

4.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the Order of 2021 shall have effect as though any waiting restriction identified in the map-based schedule and by way of the map schedule legend and marked out and signed as a waiting restriction shall be construed as through it were a restricted street referred to in the Order of 2021.

Power to modify or suspend this Order

5.1 In pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Head of Service - Highways (or such other officer of the Council as holds the post of Traffic Manager as defined in section 17 of the Traffic Management Act 2004°) may, if it appears to that officer essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway, or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by this Order runs, modify or suspend any provision of this Order, save that no modification shall make an addition.


EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Order, by way of an experiment, adds or substitutes items in the map-based schedule attached to the Order of 2021, as part of the London Streetspace Programme – Walworth 4 (which provides additional measures) to:-

- (a) in Manor Place south-east side o/s No. 171 replace 5m existing 'short stay' parking with new DYLs;
- (b) in Lytham Street north-west side o/s Nos. 3 to 21 add 42m new DYLs (to replace 'shared-use' parking); and
- (c) in Penton Place south-west side opposite No. 45 remove 16m existing DYLs, in the London Borough of Southwark.






