Whateley Road new zebra pedestrian crossing

- Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that it has approved under section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the provision of a new 'zebra' pedestrian crossing at the following location:-
 - WHATELEY ROAD, the centre of which would be located 7 metres west of the north-western kerb-line of Fellbrigg Road (as measured from the north-eastern kerb-line of Whateley Road). Zig-zag markings, on which vehicles would be prohibited from stopping at all times would be laid (i) on the north-east side of the road for a distance of 8 metres north-west of and 4 metres south-east of this crossing, and (ii) on the south-west side of the road for a distance of 4 metres north-west of and 8 metres south-east of this crossing.

Statement of reasons



Whateley Road new zebra pedestrian crossing

This proposal will introduce a formal zebra pedestrian crossing in Whateley Road (Goose Green ward), in the London Borough of Southwark.

The crossing will be located near its junctions with Cyrena Road/Fellbrigg Road. The implementations will improve current conditions, upgrade surface materials, change kerb line geometry and layout; all based on council design standards, policies and guidelines.

The implementation of the new zebra pedestrian crossing will also be accommodated by the extension of existing 'at any time' waiting restrictions (double yellow lines) at this junction which will benefit all road users through the improvement of inter-visibility and therefore road safety. The amendments to existing waiting restrictions are to be proposed within Minor Traffic Schemes Q1 (notice published 15 July 2021).
