

# Positive Future For Young People Fund (PFYPF) 2022-2024

## Stage 1 - Expression of Interest (EOI) Guidance Notes

Thank you for your interest in the Positive Future For Young People Fund (PFYPF).

Please read this information carefully and in full before completing this form.

These Guidance Notes provide details on how we will assess applications and what to avoid when completing the Expression of Interest form. They also provide information about how we process successful applications.

These EOI Guidance Notes are to assist you in making an initial Expression of Interest to the Fund. Proposals will be reviewed by the Positive Future For Young People Fund Programme Board which includes Youth Parliament members and council officers. The EOI Guidance notes should provide enough information for you to make an initial proposal.

Following the [Youth Review](#), which placed young people's voices at the heart of decision making, the council has adopted a new approach in the application process for funding under the Positive Future For Young People Fund (2022-2024), that consists of three stages with different closing dates:

### The Aim

The aim of the Positive Future For Young People Fund is to ensure that providers offer activity programmes that are informed and shaped by what young people want, as set out in the recent [Youth Review](#).

## **How much you can apply for**

The minimum award is £10,000 per annum (i.e. a minimum of £20,000 over 24 months of this programme) and the maximum award is £30,000 per annum (i.e. a maximum of £60,000 over 24 months of the programme). Application requests must not exceed this amount. The council may offer a lower amount than requested following an assessment of proposal and budget.

## **Eligibility Criteria for EOI**

We can only accept applications from organisations that are constituted, limited, a registered charity or under any other legal structure for an organisation e.g. family centres, Community Interest Companies (CIC), Tenant & Resident Associations (TRAs). If you do not fit into one of these categories, you could approach a local organisation to enquire whether they could support your application.

## **What we do fund**

Funding is for activities only. We will fund activities that are delivered in a youth setting or adventure playground tailored to meet a specific outcome, for example, a health and well-being programme. Organisations will be required to clearly articulate what activities they are seeking funding for, and what outcomes they want to achieve:

- Core staff costs
- Revenue costs (e.g. salaries)
- Operational delivery costs
- Low value equipment costs (up to £1,000 – audio visual aids, sports equipment etc.)

## **What we do not fund**

- One off events
- Private or profit-making companies
- Capital expenditure
- Political activities
- Duplication of projects
- Items purchased/unspecified expenditure prior to grant application
- General maintenance/overheads of facilities

## **What information do we ask at Stage 1 Expression of Interest (EOI)?**

- How much you are applying for
- Details of your organisation
- A brief description of the project you are applying for
- What outputs and the outcomes you aim to achieve

## **A New Approach – Positive Future For Young People Fund (PFYPF)**

There is a three stage application process in applying for the Positive Future For Young People Fund:

### **Stage 1 – Expression of Interest (EOI)**

Expressions of Interest are welcome from voluntary organisations and community groups. In submitting your EOI you are required to briefly describe your project and state why it is needed. Young people will be at the heart of the programme, therefore all application proposals should be co-designed by young people. If your idea is deemed inspiring, creative and innovative enough, it will proceed to Stage 2 - Dragons Den.

### **Things to avoid**

When completing your EOI and describing your activity, please avoid providing lengthy information or detailed statistical information. Remember, the information required is limited to **250 words (max)**.

### **Stage 2 – Dragons Den presentations**

If your EOI is successful at stage 1, you will be invited to present your idea(s) to the Programme Board at a Dragons Den presentation, details of which will be sent at a later date.

### **Stage 3 – Application online**

If successful at stage 2, you will then be invited to apply for and complete the online application form, provide supporting documentation where your application will be further assessed.

### **Project description (250 word max)**

This information will provide us with a brief overview of your project. The funding is for projects which start and end between 1<sup>st</sup> April 2022 and 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024.

### **Beneficiaries (250 word max)**

This question allows us to see how many Southwark residents will benefit from the project.

## Evidence of need (250 word max)

When completing this section, you should be as clear and specific as possible and avoid where possible, making general statements. You should evidence the need with supporting data or intelligence.

## Project Outputs and Outcomes

Applicants will be expected to deliver one or more of the outcomes criteria. Outputs are actual numbers, i.e. working with 50 young people. Outcomes are the differences or changes that the project will have on the children or young people taking part, for example increased self-confidence.

## Positive Future For Young People Fund - Outcomes Criteria

and are clearly targeted at those most vulnerable to being drawn into criminal activity rather than open access services.

- Projects that do not duplicate but can link to activities funded through existing programmes such as the council's youth grants or existing council provision working with this target group.
- Projects that help make communities, and/or young people, feel safer.
- Projects that support young ex-offenders, young people who are Care Leavers and complement partnership work on young people's mental health and wellbeing.
- Projects that support young people feeling more able to access services at an early point and in times of crisis.
- Applicants need to show that Young People are and will continue to be actively involved in delivery and be able to evidence clear impact.

### Odessa Youth Centre Programme

To enhance the current council youth programme, we are also seeking one organisation to deliver two universal sessions a week from Odessa: Docklands Youth Centre. These sessions must offer at least one of the activities listed on the EOI form in the table on Q9.

### Fast Forward Special Educational Needs and Disability Project

The council will also be seeking one organisation to deliver the council's 'Fast Forward' Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) project. The requirement will be for a specialist SEND organisation that can deliver two sessions a week from their own premises.

## Application Timeline

This is a 24 month programme; organisations can seek funding for activities that will take place during the period of funding. Applications must be submitted by 17 September 2021 for grants to operate for the period 1 April 2022 to 31 March 2024 (24 months).

Please note that organisations who are currently receiving funding from the Positive Futures Fund (PFF), and whose contract end date is June 2022, can request funding for the period 1 July 2022 – 30 June 2024.
