• No First Night Out Team

Provide rapid intensive support, advice and assistance to single people at imminent risk of a first night sleeping rough. They prevent homelessness by providing intervention and advice and work in partnership with relevant agencies to target single people at risk of sleeping rough.

• Housing First

Provide a flexible person centred approach to support homeless customers with multiple and complex needs accepted for a Housing First service. The personalised support provided will enable the customers to sustain a tenancy and address any other needs that are identified. Customers to be considered for this service are agreed at the *Complex Needs Panel.*

Sustain Team

Southwark's tenancy sustain team aims to help existing vulnerable council tenants to sustain their tenancy when they are at risk of losing their home. The sustain team are experienced in helping tenants with mental or physical health needs, those with physical or learning difficulties, younger or older tenants or those for who English is not their first language.
