Consort Road and Nazareth Gardens improvements

The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Consort Road and Nazareth Gardens) Traffic Order 202* The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting restrictions) (Consort Road and Nazareth Gardens) Order 202*

- 1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that it proposes to make the above Orders under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The effects of the Orders would be to accommodate 'one-way' eastbound operation throughout the private road which lies between the north-eastern kerb-line of Consort Road and the south-western kerb-line of Nazareth Gardens (fronting Nos. 33 to 42 Nazareth Gardens and henceforth referred to as 'the private road'):-
- (a) to prohibit access for any vehicle by way of 'no entry' signs (i) from NAZARETH GARDENS into 'the private road' and (ii) from 'the private road' into CONSORT ROAD;
- (b) to prohibit any vehicle proceeding in a northwest-bound direction in CONSORT ROAD from turning right upon reaching its junction with 'the private road';
- (c) to reduce existing 'at any time' waiting restrictions by 21.5 metres in CONSORT ROAD on the north-east side across its junction with 'the private road'; and
- (d) to convert 16 metres of existing timed waiting restrictions (single yellow lines) to new 'at any time' waiting restrictions in NAZARETH GARDENS on the south-west side across its junction with 'the private road'.

NOTES: (1) Exemption to the restrictions described in (a) and (b) preceding, would be provided for emergency services vehicles and refuse collection vehicles. (2) All measurements are in metres 'm' and are approximate. Parking charges are listed on <u>www.southwark.gov.uk/parking</u>.

Consort Road and Nazareth Gardens improvements

The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Consort Road and Nazareth Gardens) Traffic Order 202* The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting restrictions) (Consort Road and Nazareth Gardens) Order 202*

This scheme proposes permanent prescribed routes and changes to waiting restrictions in Consort Road and Nazareth Gardens within the Nunhead & Queen's Road ward and Rye Lane ward, in the London Borough of Southwark.

Planning permission (ref: 19/AP/1203) has been granted for development of the area which include 'one-way' eastbound operation throughout the private road which lies between the northeastern kerb-line of Consort Road and the south-western kerb-line of Nazareth Gardens (fronting Nos. 33 to 42 Nazareth Gardens and henceforth referred to as 'the private road').

To accommodate the 'one-way' working and clear access to 'the private road' there will be:


- no access for any vehicle by way of 'no entry' signs (i) from Nazareth Gardens into 'the private road' and (ii) from 'the private road' into Consort Road;
- (b) no right turn for any vehicle proceeding in a northwest-bound direction in Consort Road at its junction with 'the private road'; and
- (c) changes to waiting restrictions across junctions with 'the private road' (i) on the north-east side of Consort Road existing 'at any time' waiting restrictions will be reduced by 21.5 metres, and (ii) on the south-west side of Nazareth Gardens 16 metres of existing timed waiting restrictions (single yellow lines) will be upgraded to new 'at any time' waiting restrictions (double yellow lines).

Citation and commencement

1.1 This Order may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Consort Road and Nazareth Gardens) Traffic Order 202* and shall come into force on ** ******* 202*.

Interpretation

2.1 In this Order:-

causing includes permitting;

"carriageway" has the same meaning as in section 329(1) of the Highways Act 1980^b;

"Council" means the Council of the London Borough of Southwark;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

"kerb-line" means the imaginary line which is the projection of the line formed by the edge of the carriageway of a street; and

"the private road" for the purposes of this Order, means the full carriageway (of which is private) which lies between the north-eastern kerb-line of Consort Road and the south-western kerb-line of Nazareth Gardens (fronting Nos. 33 to 42 Nazareth Gardens).

2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.

Prescribed routes

- 3.1 No person causing any vehicle to proceed in a north-westbound direction in Consort Road, shall upon reaching its junction with "the private road", cause that vehicle to turn right into "the private road".
- 3.2 No person causing any vehicle to proceed in "the private road", shall upon reaching its junction with Consort Road, cause that vehicle to enter into or proceed in Consort Road.
- 3.3 No person causing any vehicle to proceed in Nazareth Gardens, shall upon reaching its junction with "the private road", cause that vehicle to enter into or proceed in "the private road".

Exemptions

- 4.1 Nothing in Articles 3.1, 3.2 and 3.3 of this Order shall apply in relation to:-
 - (a) a vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes; or
 - (b) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or
 - (c) any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

This Order, to accommodate 'one-way' eastbound operation throughout "the private road" (which lies between Consort Road and Nazareth Gardens), provides: no access from Nazareth Gardens into "the private road", and no access from "the private road" into Consort Road, and no right turn for any vehicle proceeding in a northwest-bound direction in Consort Road at its junction with "the private road", in the London Borough of Southwark.

Citation, commencement and expiry

1.1This Order may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Waiting restrictions) (Consort
Road and Nazareth Gardens) Order 202* and shall come into force on202*.

Interpretation

2.1 In this Order:-

"Council" means the Council of the London Borough of Southwark;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

"map-based schedule" means the map attached to and to be read in conjunction with this Order and the Order of 2021, which depicts the restrictions imposed by this Order, and, in conjunction with the map schedule legend, identifies the type of each particular waiting restriction, and, if appropriate, certain of its governing provisions:

Provided that the Council does not accept responsibility for any inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon to create the map-based schedule and where a waiting restriction is depicted on the map-based schedule, that waiting restriction will continue to apply irrespective of any subsequent changes that have been made to the underlying Ordnance Survey data.

"map schedule legend" means the map schedule legend attached to this Order which, when used in conjunction with the map-based schedule, identifies the specific type of waiting restrictions imposed by this Order and, where appropriate, certain of their governing provisions; and

"the Order of 2021" means the London Borough of Southwark (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Map-based) Order 2021^b.

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2021 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Amendment of items in the map-based schedule

- 3.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done, or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the Order of 2021 shall have effect as though there were added to that map-based schedule the items indicating the location of waiting restrictions in Nazareth Gardens in the map-based schedule attached to this Order, and amended in that map-based schedule the items indicating restrictions in Consort Road in the map-based schedule attached to this Order.
- 3.2 The amendments referred to in Article 3.1 of this Order of an item in the map-based schedule will have the effect of revoking any provision provided or designated by a previous version of that item in the map-based schedule and not incorporated into the latest version.

Waiting restrictions applicable in restricted streets

4.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the Order of 2021 shall have effect as though any waiting restriction identified in the map-based schedule and by way of the map schedule legend and marked out and signed as a waiting restriction shall be construed as through it were a restricted street referred to in the Order of 2021.

This Order, applies the provisions of, and adds items to the map-based schedule attached to the Order of 2021, make changes to waiting restrictions across junctions with 'the private road' (i) on the northeast side of Consort Road existing DYLs reduced by 21.5 metres, and (ii) on the south-west side of Nazareth Gardens 16 metres of existing SYLs converted to DYLs, in the London Borough of Southwark.
