	Redevelopment of Southwark Fire Station, 94 Southwark Bridge Road, London SE OEG; Grotto Place and Grotto Podiums including alterations and extensions to listed buildings for a mixed use scheme to provide a new secondary school with 6th form (up to 1150 pupils), 199 residential units, 234 sqm of flexible commercial community use (Class A1, A3, B1, D1, D2), a 139 sqm Gym (D2), associated landscape and public realm works, cycle parking, disabled parking and servicing access; and the redevelopment of land at Grotto Place for the provision of a new sports hall (1,452sqm) and external multi use games facility and landscaping.
