Welcome to the latest edition of the Tustin Estate monthly newsletter from Southwark Council.

The residents of the Tustin Estate have voted for the demolition and rebuild of Bowness House, Heversham House, Hillbeck Close and Kentmere House, and the refurbishment of the council houses on Manor Grove.

# **Demolition Notices**

The Council has sent residents in the Tustin low rise blocks demolition notices. A demolition notice informs the residents in Bowness House, Heversgham House, Hillbeck Close and Kentmere House that the council intends to proceed with the redevelopment plans that will involve demolishing their home in the future.

Demolition notices are issued in two stages, with the first notice issued to residents when the Council is planning to demolish their property within the next seven years. It does not mean that demolition work is about to start.

Once a demolition notice has been served it will mean tenants cannot claim the Right to Buy in their current home. Tenants will have the Right to Buy in the new homes built on Tustin, or it they move to another Council home.

The Notice does not affect homeowners who have already bought their homes on the Tustin Estate.

# **Drop-in Public Exhibition**

dRMM are hosting a public exhibition to update you on the new designs for the new homes on the Tustin Estate, along with estate improvements. dRMM will show how they included residents' feedback.

dRMM have plenty of drawings and images to share about new homes, estate landscape, and community amenities. Come along to have a look, dRMM would love to hear what you think!




They will be held on:

## Designer's + Maker's Week -25 to 29 October

During the October half term holiday, a group of young residents living on Tustin Estate took part in a new Designers and Makers week competition arranged by dRMM and team. The participants were given a design brief to create a new outdoor space/park, titled 'outside for longer'.

The week saw young people work with the landscape architects, engineers, sustainability consultants and architects working on the Tustin estate to develop their design ideas. The week also saw some special collaborations, including visiting F.A.T Studios, a design studio based in an ex-retail space on the Old Kent Road, just a 2 minute walk from Tustin Estate. The budding young designers worked with F.A.T Studios to explore design development through illustration and sketching techniques.

Participants also spent a day with local photographer Dominic Markers, who is a street and documentary photographer based in South East London. The young creatives took to the street with their cameras to document what they like and dislike about surrounding public spaces in their borough. These images were then used to create board moods to help develop their design ideas.

Toward the end the young people visited dRMM architects for a studio day working with their model maker. This was an opportunity for young people to focus on an element of their design idea and bring it to life.



The last day saw them work with an actor training collective to help them develop their communication skills ahead of their design pitch. Each of the aspiring designers pitched to a decision making panel, composed of Neil Kirby from Southwark Council, Neil Onions from Beyond The Box Consultants who designed the week's programme and Mike Baldwin of dRMM Architects. The Top prize of £450 was awarded to 14 year old Victoria and her submission titled 'Fragmental Ego living'. All young people who took part will also access a week's work experience placement in an architecture studio.

# **Developer Appointment**

We are pleased to announce that Linkcity, part of the Bouygues group, has been appointed to deliver preconstruction services for the Tustin Estate following a competitive tender process. Linkcity will work with the council and the design team to ensure that the designs are buildable and to plan the construction phase. The council will then look to negotiate an agreement with Linkcity to deliver the new homes, the schools and the green space at the centre of the estate. Linkcity has been selected with the help of residents who scored the tenders and took part in interviews. The team have a wealth of experience in delivering large scale rebuild projects, in close collaboration with residents.

The Linkcity team are looking forward to working closely with residents over the coming months – come meet the team at architects' exhibition on 9 and 11 December 2021.

## Have you had your COVID-19 vaccination?

Over 192,000 people registered with a Southwark GP have received a first dose of the vaccine. You can:

- Book online using the NHS national booking service or call 119 free of charge (ages 12 and above)
- Contact your GP (ages 12 and above)
- Use a walk-in clinic in Southwark if you are 12 or over
- Take part in the school-based vaccination programme (ages 12 to 15)

If you had your second dose at least six months ago, you'll be contacted about your third (booster) jab if you are:

- Living in a residential care home for older adults
- Aged 50 or over
- A frontline health and social care worker
- Aged 16 to 49 years with underlying health conditions that put you at higher risk of severe COVID-19

• An adult household contact of an immunosuppressed person/people.

If you have not been contacted, but it has been six months and one week since your second dose, you can try to book your appointment online using the NHS national booking service.
